- the longest-standing provider to work with Cincinnati Public Schools at district and school levels with access to school
- the only local organization to offer a full range of youth development services both within and outside of schools

Program Success

CYC is very proud of its success! CYC was founded in 1982 to combat the staggering high school dropout rate in Greater Cincinnati. Over three decades, CYC has served more than 160,000 students.

- Increase number of students served: We will explore the incorporation of an e-mentoring platform into our existing mentoring services.








How Did CYC Invest Its Funds?


When you mentor, your intention may be to influence the life of a child. But, I can guarantee that the family will be affected in a positive way.
