

Meet Asia Crawford

Like many of the students we serve, Asia has dealt with the insurmountable obstacles brought about because of the pandemic. As a result, she was socially and academically unmotivated and struggled to discover ways to reengage with her peers and academics. However, during this challenging time in her life, Asia had the support of her CYC P&G mentors, who have been a constant positive light in her life since she was in eighth grade. Her mentors performed daily checkins, ensured the students were on track to achieve success post-graduation, and were motivations for Asia and her peers. Now, because of the support and guidance Asia received in our Mentoring program, she is a University of Cincinnati student studying Business with the dream of starting a beauty salon and product store.



COLLEGE AND CAREER SUCCESS

Beginning in middle school, CYC provides comprehensive career and college guidance to partner schools. Programs supply individualized support and mentoring to ensure graduation and a successful post-secondary education transition. CYC AmeriCorps College Guides and GEAR UP Ohio Advisors provide:

- ACT/SAT test prep support
- Financial aid (FAFSA), college application support, scholarships, and grants
- Career exploration and planning
- 12-month follow-up services to support the transition from high school
- Beginning in middle school, CYC provides comprehensive career and college guidance to partner schools.

A 2021 graduate of CYC's GEAR UP program at Norwood High School. She grew up in a family of immigrants who only spoke Arabic. As a result, as a child, it was difficult for her to understand and master English. In her last two years at Norwood High School, she also struggled with explaining the college admission process to her parents. However, the support and diligence of her GEAR UP advisors, Savanna Dayberry and Kaitlin Lott, proved pivotal for Daliah's success. The two advisors spent numerous hours with Daliah's parents comforting them and walking them through the college admission process. Due to Savannah and Kaitlin's hard work, Daliah is currently a sophomore at the University of Cincinnati studying Health Science.

WORK READINESS

The CYC Jobs for Cincinnati Graduates (JCG) Program is a nationally accredited year-round in-school program that prepares students for post-secondary career pursuits through career awareness, exploration, guidance, and placement. Specific focus areas include:

- Classroom experiences for both middle school and high school students via a 1-credit hour class that meets every day of the school year
- Leadership and self-development via the JCG Career Association, the Career Development Conference, and both professional and personal core competency skills
- Summer work experiences for high school seniors and rising 9th graders that build employability skills and career learning through on-site experiences, including compensation
- 12-month follow-up services to support the transition from high school

Meet Joe Carter

A 2021 graduate of CYC's Jobs for Cincinnati Graduates program at Shroder High School. As a young kid, Joe struggled with public speaking and lacked the confidence to express himself. However, in 7th grade, he was introduced to the JCG program. The presentations and daily activities ignited Joe's passion for school and speaking in front of crowds. Throughout Joe's middle school and high school career, he continued to have tremendous

growth and success. With the support of JCG and the guidance of his JCG specialist, Mike Davis, Joe graduated from Shroder and enlisted in the United States Navy.



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RESOURCE COORDINATION

CYC Resource Coordinators support local schools (Gamble, Dater, & Woodward) in implementing the Community Learning Center (CLC) model, a nationally recognized model of engaging school and community stakeholders to align resources to impact student success and promote vibrant communities. Provided services include:

- Educational assistance through the implementation of tutoring, after-school, and academic success programming
- Career guidance by facilitating college and career fairs, field trips, workshops, and more
- Social-emotional support by providing access to physical and mental health services and a positive environment for all to express themselves

Resource Coordination Highlights

In partnership with the Freestore Foodbank, James N. Gamble Montessori High School established an in-house school pantry filled with non-perishable foods to help with food scarcity. Students and their families shop in the pantry at no cost and receive the items needed for their families.

Through a powerful collaboration with the Cincinnati Police Department and their Get Groceries Day Campaign, one

Additionally, thanks to a generous donation from Seven Hills Church, boxes of food were distributed to over 20 families in the community during the 2021 Thanksgiving season.
