THE MENTORING PROGRAM

One-to-One Mentoring

Matches caring adult mentors with students on a one-to-one basis; grades 2-12, and students within their first two years of college.

Our mentoring program offers unique focuses to each stage within a student's academic career:

- Grades 2-6: Focus on Social-Emotional Competencies (Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills, Goal Directed Behavior, Personal Responsibility, Decision Making, and Opportunistic Thinking) and Academic Success.
- Grades 7-12; Focus on supporting students' pathway after high school
- · Post-secondary; Focus on persistence and retention of students in college

Co-Mentoring

An opportunity where two adults share in the mentoring of a student. This mentoring option offers great flexibility and is oftentimes the preferred choice for young professionals. Enjoy all the elements of one-to-one

mentoring but share it with someone else (Co-worker, Spouse, Friend).

Group Mentoring

This program offers exceptional flexibility. A team of mentors share the responsibility of meeting with a group of students on a regular basis. Focus areas can include: Social-Emotional Competencies, life skills, anti-violence, anti-drug, financial literacy, and more. Programs vary based on the group of mentors, students, and school needs,

- Career advising




THE WORK READINESS PROGRAM
