
## From Quiet Confidence to Career Success

When our partner AtriCure announced a hiring event, we knew Lawrence would be a great candidate. Our team worked closely with him to craft a resume, practice interview skills, and




prepare professional attire. On interview day, Lawrence arrived confident and well-prepared for his interview, answering questions with poise.

Since starting training this summer, he has shared how this opportunity has positively impacted both his life and his family, allowing him to contribute to their household income and build a strong foundation for his future. ## Volunteers Making a Difference

Amplifying partnership is at the core of our work. CYC exists to enhance the leadership, education, career, and college readiness of the young people we serve. Before joining JCG, Mariah had only a limited view of the professional world. However, through engaging career development sessions led by JCG Career Specialist, Ms. Woody, she gained exposure to a wide variety of fields. These experiences expanded her outlook and helped her identify her true passion: firefighting.

After high school graduation, Mariah successfully completed CYC's Summer Work Experience Opportunity internship program (paid) with the Woodlawn Fire Department. The experience both challenged and

motivated her, solidifying her desire to serve her community and showed her the real-world impact she could make.

Mariah is now enrolled in Cincinnati State's EMT program. She is taking the next step toward becoming a full-fledged first responder, combining her classroom training with the hands-on experience she gained during her internship.



Mariah credits CYC as the catalyst for her transformation and shares that JCG was a turning point in her life. The experience didn't just prepare her for a career; it empowered her to dream bigger, push harder, and step boldly into a future she had never before imagined.
